

BUYING FROM A PRIVATE PERSON

1. Must be a **Resident of Michigan*** and have **Michigan Driver's License** or **PID**.
2. Request a **Purchase Permit (RI-010)** from a law enforcement agency.
(*not all agencies have the ability to issue an RI-010, so call first*)

This step **does not apply** if you have a valid **Michigan CPL**, or you are currently **MCOLES Certified**, if that is the case, **use the RI-060 form** (on-line at MSP's website:

https://www.michigan.gov/documents/msp/ri-060_523727_7.pdf).

3. Once you have completed your firearm transfer, file your **Purchase Permit (RI-010)** or **Pistol Sales Record (RI-060)** within 10-business days, it **can** be mailed. **DON'T BRING YOUR FIREARM IN FOR INSPECTION!!**

RI-010 (yellow card stock) -	return to agency who issued
RI-060 -	return to agency with jurisdiction over your residence

BUYING FROM A FEDERAL FIREARMS DEALER

1. When **purchasing** a firearm in Michigan from a **Federal Firearms Dealer** they will complete the background check. Once approved, they will complete and sign the RI-060, providing you with 2 copies (1 for your records/1 for your local law enforcement agency).
2. Once you have the two copies of your RI-060 return the MSP copy of your RI-060 (Pistol Sales Record) to the **law enforcement agency with jurisdiction over your residence** (recommended you call first as not all agencies have the ability to enter your data into the MSP maintained data base).

The law requires you to keep your copy of the pistol sales record or purchase permit for at least 30 days however, since this is the **ONLY** copy you will ever receive it is recommended that you maintain your copy in a safe and secure location.

*You **may** qualify in Michigan if you are **registered to vote in Michigan** (show voter registration card if you don't have a valid Michigan issued state ID).

*If **active Military** and YOU are stationed permanently in Michigan, or Michigan is your state of residence.
